## you're making a difference in your own Frontyard


Frontyard Youth Services is MCM's King Street one-stop shop for young people experiencing homelessness.

Frontyard operates the only Statewide specialist access point for young people aged 16-24 seeking to access the Homelessness Services system, including an 18-bed CBD-based crisis accommodation service for complex young people experiencing rough sleeping.

Young people voted on a new name for the accommodation program, choosing Circuit Breaker. You may be wondering what a circuit breaker has to do with homelessness. Young people thought it represented the chance to break the cycle of homelessness and find the path to stability and safe housing.

Thank you for being a part of this ground-breaking, integrated model of accommodation that provides vulnerable young people with holistic trauma-informed and healing-oriented support. Through this intensive model, you are helping to change the life trajectory of young people away from being entrenched in the service system. You are helping to break the cycle of homelessness.





A family breakdown forced 15-year-old Nhala into homelessness. She spent two years couch surfing with friends across Melbourne, and was sometimes even forced to sleep at McDonalds or outside youth homelessness services.

"I wouldn't wish that on any young person, ever," Nhala says.

"Imagine finishing work and not knowing...
where you're going to stay."

It's a space where children with developmental delays and learning disabilities are helped to learn and develop at a pace that works for them. It's also a place where parents, carers and families are welcome and supported.

### 10 YEARS OF KEEPING YOUNG DRIVERS SAFE

MCM's TAC L2P Learner Driver Mentor Program recently celebrated its 10-year anniversary.

MCM's L2P Learner Driver Mentor Program was started in 2012 by a Rotary club in Sunbury. The club's members recognised how difficult it would be for vulnerable young people to get their license under a new system that required them to have 120 hours of supervised driving.

Since then, an amazing **287 young people have got their drivers' license** through the program.

## ON THE BUSES IN BENDIGO



MCM has helped deliver Recovery Coach services to people with a mental health disability in the Bendigo area since 2019.

Recovery Coaches spend time with each client, working to understand what each person wants and needs. That can range from improved support for a mental health issue or more social connection, to meaningful employment. Then they'll connect the client with the best support and services in their local area.

Kat Kenyon, one of our coaches, says the most rewarding part of her role is seeing positive outcomes for the people she works with.

"Being involved in and supporting and guiding our participants to reach their goals is very rewarding, especially seeing them take control of their lives and reach a goal like finding work or taking up study."
